## The Quarry

Located between the 7th and 8th holes, the quarry ceased work in 1870 having supplied stone for many of the local houses. It is fed from a source around the area of Fenwick on the A77.



## Clubhouse sunset

A very familiar scene for the members, the warm glow of the sunset is reflected off the Clubhouse windows and warms the steeple of the St. Nicholas church in the distance.



## Rainbow, West Kilbride

Beyond the 2nd green, and to the right of the 3rd are the Salt Pan Houses. Dating back to circa 1760, they were known as the Maryburgh Salt Works and boiled off salt from sea water to sell.



## Red Arrows

The highlight of the Scottish Air Show are the Red Arrows and here they are at the end of their Sunday display in 2018. The back of the 6th green is a great vantage point across the Bay.

## John Wilson

Carried high on the shoulders of the crowd, John Wilson of Prestwick St. Nicholas wins the Scottish Amateur Championship for the second time in 1931. He was the inaugural winner in 1922.
